Folder Axe was made with one purpose in mind, and that is to help you split up your folders into multiple smaller ones.

Features:

Split by amount (Specify the number of files each resulting folder is limited to)

Split by size (Specify the size limit of each resulting folder) Sort Mode Explanation

Split by name (Created folders based upon the first x number of characters in file names)

Split by file type (Files split into folders according to their extensions)

Split by file group (Files split into seven different groups) See the File Groups page for more info

Split by date (Files split into folders by date property)

Include files in subfolders (Optionally)

Compress resulting folders into Zip files, even protect them using AES-256 bit encryption

Set the naming scheme for the resulting folders

Remember chosen folder during session

Process folders of any size, fast!

Automatic update checking, so you always have the latest version

Log window so you know exactly what's going on at all times

ReStartMe is designed to do one thing, and that is to restart processes. Let me explain, the way ReStartMe is used is that when it is started, you add processes to watch. You can either start a new program, or add a currently running process. Once you tell ReStartMe to watch a process, it will watch it, but it won't react until the process exits. When a process that ReStartMe is watching exits for any reason, whether it was closed properly or not, ReStartMe will restart it.

## Features:

Select from running processes

Start a new process by browsing for an executable file

Multiple processes may be watched at one time

Minimizes to system tray so as not to clutter your task bar

Ability to password protect the window so that others can't add or remove processes from the watch list, or close ReStartMe

Ability to remember processes between uses (When a previous process isn't there the next time ReStartMe starts, it can either do nothing, watch for it, or start it)

Ability to start with Windows (For the current user)

Ability to start minimized in the system tray

Checks for updates silently, and only alerts you if one is found

Easy to use!

**Compare Folders** allows the user to compare the contents of two folders against each other. This can be done with or without extensions.

## Features:

Compare the files in a folder by their names and extensions, or just by their names

Files that only occur in one folder get a check in their check boxes

The checked files can be copied to the other folder

The checked files can be deleted (To the recycling bin)

**Free HDD LED** shows hard disk drive activity in real time in the systray area.

It monitors all physical hard disk drives connected to the pc (ide/sata/usb).

What's new in 0.3:

- auto rescan for new drives (useful if you plug an usb hdd)
- the window can be set as transparent (3 different levels)
- admin rights check at startup

The [WinSpy index.dat viewer](#) lets you read the contents of your index.dat files (it's free and a small download). If you are not familiar with these files, don't be surprised - they are hidden on your computer. Windows uses index.dat files to organize data on your system. They reside in the Cookies, History and Internet Explorer's cache folders. This presents two problems: Index.dat files can grow quite large and as they increase in size, they tend to be bogged down with unneeded data - making them less efficient. Secondly, snoopers can recover the index.dat file and read details such as your History, even though the items may have already been 'deleted' from the History folder.
