For our May meeting we were educated on-line on the subject of Apps: *What are they and how to get them.* The presenter was: Jim Glass, President, Glendora Computer Club, Glendora, CA.

Jim went over the types of apps and how they can improve your use of mobile devices and how they can be deleterious in the way they track your location and your every tap, click and URL visited.

Details on how to obtain them were provided along with instructions on how to remove them. He pointed out that you can only get apps for an Apple products. i.e. iPad, Apple TV, etc. from the Apple store.

For Android powered smartphones you can get apps from the Windows and Google app stores.

There are apps for every kind of use: educational; productivity; financial; games; news and weather; internet security; communication; utilities to clean up and speed up your device; audio and e-books; you name it and , as you've most likely heard, "We've got an app for that".

Most of the apps are free but a number of them come with random ads that pop up from time to time. If you purchase the app, the ads disappear.


Genesis of The TUG
